Easy steps you can take right now to save

Hot Water	Set your hot water temperature to no higher than 120°F.	Free-\$15; saves 4-22%+ annually
Windows	Especially if you have single-pane windows, install storm windows to reduce drafts and keep your heating costs down. Look for "Low-E" windows.	\$60-\$200/window; saves 12-33% annually
Phantom Loads	Electronics draw energy even when they're not in use. Biggest offenders include microwaves, TVs, computers, printers, coffee makers and video game consoles. Use a power strip, or unplug them!	Free to \$15/power strip. Receive 2 no-cost power strips with a Mass Save Assessment
LED Light Bulbs	Switching to LEDs is a highly cost-effective way to save energy	<\$1/bulb, or free with a Mass Save Assessment
Thermostats	Check your thermostat settings. Reducing the temperature by a few degrees in the winter can make a big difference in your heating bills. Consider having a programmable or "smart" thermostat installed	Free/varies. Free programmable thermostats and discounted smart thermostats available through Mass Save
Washing Machine/Dryer Settings	When possible, wash clothes in cold water and dry at low temperatures	Saves approx. \$0.15/wash & \$0.36/dry
EnergySTAR	When upgrading appliances, look for the energy star label	Energy star labels provide estimated savings (savings vary by product)

Commonly recommended Mass Save improvements

Air Sealing	After your Assessment, a Specialist can come back to caulk air leaks, weather-strip doors and windows, and install foam gaskets behind outlets.	Free through Mass Save
Insulation	A Specialist can install (likely spray foam) insulation in your walls and attic. This can be done relatively non-invasively.	At least a 75% rebate through Mass Save
Hot Water Heater Upgrade	If you have an older, inefficient hot water heater, a Specialist may recommend an upgrade	\$600-\$700 rebates
Heating System Upgrade	A Specialist may recommend you upgrade to a more efficient heating system. You can also ask about switching to a different source of heat, such as electric air-source heat pumps.	Rebates vary based on system age and type
Appliance Upgrades	If you have an old, inefficient appliance, a Specialist may recommend replacing it. Mass Save offers rebates for many appliances, and free haul-away services for refrigerators.	\$50-\$250 rebates
NEW: Fuel Switching/ Solar	If you heat with oil or propane, a Specialist may recommend switching to a more efficient source of heat, like natural gas (if it's available) or electric heat pumps. They might also recommend solar.	Varies
